## Down Sand Mountain by Steve Watkins

In a small town, set in 1966, 12 year old Dewey faces one worst-day-ever after another but over time comes to know that his issues with bullies, girls, race, and identity are part of the adult world.

## Egghead by Caroline Pignat

Delves into how bullying can affect the victim, the bully, and also the bystanders.

## End Game by Nancy Garden

A boy who shoots several classmates is stopped from killing himself. He then recounts the events that led up to his rampage.

# Exposure by Patricia Murdoch

Julie has been bullied for years. She gets her hands on pictures of her main bully and decides to use them for revenge. But then everything goes wrong.

# Fade to Black by Jaime Adoff

An HIV positive student is attacked, a person who has bullied the victim in the past is seen in the area, and the only witness is a girl with Down's syndrome.

# Fancy White Trash by Marjetta Geerling

Fifteen-year-old Abby struggles with her highly dysfunctional family while her best friend Cody deals with the challenges of coming out to himself and his friends.

#### Freak by Marcella F. Pixlev

Miriam is smart, poetic, and quirky. She is considered a freak by the popular girls. Eventually, she explodes in response to their bullying, revealing an inner strength she didn't even know she had.

#### Freak Show by James St. James

# Hate List by Jennifer Brown

Valerie's boyfriend, Nick brings a gun to school and killed many students, including himself. Many people believe she was involved, but she had no idea. After spending weeks in the hospital recovering from a gunshot wound to the leg, Valerie is moved to the psychiatric ward for observation. Later, during therapy, she thinks back on her relationship with Nick and the events which led to the terrible act that changed her community.

## Hello, Groin by Beth Goobie

Wanting to be normal, 16-year-old Dylan Kowolski tries to hide her lesbianism and develop sexual feelings for her boyfriend at the same time she has a passionate crush on her best female friend.

# Jumped by Rita Williams-Garcia

Three female teens connect and learn about how choices have consequences, sometimes dire.

Tom is too young for his grade and too small for his age. Tom tells his story like it is in a funny way.

The Sisters of Misery are a nasty group of high school girls who live in the affluent seaside community of Hawthorne, Massachusetts. This exclusive click is run by Kate, who is out to ridicule, demoralize, control, and destroy anyone who doesn't fit.

# Sleeping Freshman Never Lie by David Lubar

Scott is struggling with high school, so he begins to write down tips for his younger siblings.

#### Speak by Laurie Halse Anderson

Melinda is a high school student who is a victim of bullying. Through this story she finds her voice.

#### The Beckoners by Carrie Mac

Zoe is forced to move to a new town and must deal with bullies at her new school.

A Seattle fifteen-year-old explains some of the reasons for her recent panic attacks, including breaking up with her boyfriend, losing all her girlfriends, and tensions between her performance-artist mother and her father.

# The Bully (The Bluford High Series Book 5) by Paul Langan and Anne Schraff

Darrell must deal with a new home, new school, and new bully.

# The Chocolate War by Robert Cormier

A high school freshman discovers the devastating consequences of refusing to join in the school's annual fund raising drive and arousing the wrath of the school bullies.

#### *The Dark Davs of Hamburger Halpin* by Josh Berk

When Will Halpin transfers from his all-deaf school into a mainstream Pennsylvania high school, he faces discrimination and bullying, but still manages to solve a mystery surrounding the death of a football player in his class.

## The Hate List by Jennifer Brown

Sixteen-year-old Valerie, whose boyfriend Nick committed a school shooting at the end of their junior year, struggles to cope with integrating herself back into high school life, unsure herself whether she was a hero or a villain.

## The Lottery by Beth Goobie

Discusses teen social issues, conflicts, drama, and the things teachers don't know about.

## The Revealers by Doug Wilheim

Russell, Catalina, and Elliot are all victims of different kinds of bullying. Together, they decide to take a stand and stop the bullying.

## The Sweetheart of Prosper County by Jill Alexander

In a small East Texas town largely ruled by prejudices and bullies, Austin sets out to win a ride in the next parade and, in the process, grows in her understanding of friendship and helps her widowed mother through her mourning.

# The Vast Fields of Ordinary by Nick Burd

During his last summer before college, Dade juggles his divorcing parents and dysfunctional-closeted boyfriend until he meets Alex and gains the courage to declare his sexuality.

# This Is What I Did by Ann Lee Ellis

Bullied because of an incident in his past, eighth-grader Logan is unhappy at his new school and has difficulty relating to others until he meets a quirky girl and a counselor who believe in him.

# Twisted by Laurie Halse Anderson

After finally getting noticed by someone other than the school bullies, Tyler enjoys his tough new reputation until life gets bad again.

# Whale Talk by Chris Crutcher

A group of misfits, led by T.J., form a swim team. T.J. decides to change the idea of what an athlete is. His goal for the season is to have every person on the swim team earn a letter.

# What Happened to Cass McBride? by Gail Giles

Cass has a strange upbringing. Kyle has the type of childhood you wouldn't wish upon anyone. Ben, a police detective, has a story to tell. We don't get to hear David's story, as he is dead, but we learn about a boy who never even had a chance.

# Word Nerd by Susin Nielson

Ambrose is a positive kind of guy. However, when the school bullies knowingly put a peanut into his sandwich when he is allergic, he is pulled out of school. His mother decides to homeschool him instead. Ambrose then pesters and befriends Cosmo, the older guy who just moved in upstairs, straight out of jail.
